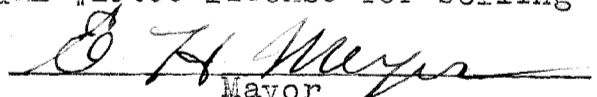

Messimer Diesel Atlas Engine, same type identically as the one now in operation at this plant, with drive belt to present generator, and all of above fully installed at the light plant at Deer Trail Colorado, at above price;

That the sum of \$3,000.00 to be paid in six equal payments by the Town of Deer Trail giving its notes as follows to draw 6% interest after maturity.

\$500 payable in six months,

\$500 payable in one year,

\$500 payable in eighteen months,

\$500 payable in two years,

\$500 payable in two years and six months,

\$500 payable in three years.;

That the Crane-O'Fallon Co., give the Town of Deer Trail a satisfactory guarantee to make the town whole against any balance block breaking or other breakage due to poor workmanship or material; the above guarantee to cover both engines for a period of five years."

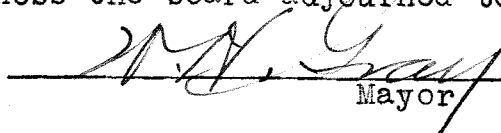
